Aronoff Center for the Performing Arts



The Aronoff Center for the Performing Arts is located in the heart of downtown Cincinnati. Designed by renowned architect Cesar Pelli, the state-of-the-art facility opened in 1995. The Center consists of three stunning performance spaces. It is home of the Cincinnati Ballet Company, Broadway Across America and multiple regional and local theatrical performances, as well as national, regional, and local music groups.

Procter & Gamble Hall is the largest performance space and has a fully equipped stage, state-of-the-art sound and lighting and a beautiful ceiling studded with 3,000 fiber optic lenses that create a starlight effect. The rich color scheme of terra cotta, teal and ochre is accented with brass trim and cherry wood. Excellent sightlines and comfortable seating add to the enjoyment of any event.

The Jarson-Kaplan Theater is the middle-sized theater and is a perfect setting for small and medium-sized performances. The theater is surprisingly intimate with full production capabilities, great acoustics, an attractive design and excellent sightlines.

The Aronoff Center will be utilized throughout the entire two-week run of the 2012 World Choir Games for competitions, special themed Celebration Concerts and the Champions Concert for week one.
